REMINDER OF POLICIES

Policy # TRSP-001 – To establish a policy for private drains draining into municipal infrastructure

Policy # TRSP-006 – To establish a policy governing the permitted use of undeveloped municipal road allowances.
This policy is under review for amendment at this time.

Please watch for letters from Council pertaining to the above policies reminding landowners that Council permission is needed for any private drains and for clearing and/or farming undeveloped municipal road allowances.

PROPERTY TAX ARREARS

Property taxes are an important source of revenue that help the RM of Alonsa provide essential services such as road maintenance, emergency services, and municipal operations.

Residents are reminded that tax arrears notices are issued annually, and courtesy reminder letters will be mailed prior to further action. These letters include important deadlines, and we strongly encourage ratepayers to review them carefully.

If you receive a letter or have questions about your tax account, please contact the municipal office as soon as possible. Early communication can help avoid additional penalties or fees.

WHEN YOUR iPhone DIALS 911

Some iPhones are set to automatically call 911 if they detect a sudden impact, such as a motor vehicle accident

Our Fire Departments are occasionally being dispatched to "accidents" that have not occurred. This can happen if an iPhone is dropped or thrown with enough force to trigger the emergency call feature.

If this happens to you, please call 911 immediately and inform the dispatcher that there is no emergency. This helps prevent emergency responders from being dispatched unnecessarily.

SNOW CLEARING & PLOWING

During the winter months, our Public Works staff work hard to keep roads safe and passable for residents.

Please be advised that municipal roads are always our first priority. Main roads, school bus routes, and heavily travelled roads must be cleared before crews can move on to private approaches and driveways.

We understand that waiting for driveway access can be frustrating, especially after heavy snowfall. Please know that crews are working as quickly and efficiently as possible, often in challenging weather conditions, to ensure the road network is opened safely.

Your patience and understanding are greatly appreciated as we continue to focus on keeping the RM moving.

REMINDER

Pushing snow across municipal roads can create ridges that harden very quickly which can cause road conditions that are dangerous to the general traffic and our municipal operators. These ridges can lead to a serious accident or cause major damage to our machines.

New Driving Laws in Effect

As of January 1, 2026

When approaching or passing snowplows with blue warning lights activated, drivers must stay back 30 metres on 80 km/h or slower roads, and stay back 100 metres on roads with a speed limit above 80 km/h. Drivers must not pass if the view ahead is obstructed or passing risks interfering with the vehicle or work.
